### **REMITTANCE FORM INSTRUCTIONS**

### A. Shared Mission

This section is for remitting general undesignated mission funds to be distributed to Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly according to the percentages approved by Presbytery or alternate percentages approved by session.

## **B.** Directed Mission

This section is for remitting general designated mission funds to be distributed to particular projects with the mission budgets of Presbytery, Synod, and/or General Assembly. Prior approval for the designation is to be received from the receiving governing body.

Designations for Presbytery, Synod, and/or G.A. projects should be entered including the project number, description, and amount for each project.

# C. PCUSA Special Offerings

Churches remitting funds for one of the denomination's Special Offering should enter the amount on the appropriate line. Please note that the church is invited to retain a portion of the Peacemaking and Pentecost offerings for use within the congregation and/or local community in accordance with guidelines for each offering.

### D. Other Giving

This section is remitting funds for all other causes.

### E. Extra Commitment Opportunity

Churches remitting funds for an Extra Commitment Opportunity project should enter the amount and list the project number and description. ECO projects must be approved by General Assembly in advance.
