The stated meeting of the Presbytery of Central Nebraska convened at 9:00 a.m. via ZOOM on Saturday, October 24, 2020. The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer by Moderator Kirwin Stewart. The Presbytery was welcomed by Kirwin Stewart.

STATED CLERK'S REPORT

Stated Clerk Polly Deppen–Williams established that there was a quorum present. In her opinion there is no remedial action needed to redress any imbalance in voting. Her report also listed the roster of members of the Presbytery and their positions and the churches in the Presbytery.

Vice–Moderator Sharon Rees gave announcements and information on using ZOOM for the meeting. Stated Clerk Polly Deppen–Williams stated that because this was a ZOOM meeting, voting on motions would be by dissention or exception only.

The Docket was presented and approved.

Corresponding Members Audrey Richert of the Presbytery Foundation and guest speaker Vilmarie Cintron–Olivieri were introduced.

First-time Commissioner Lauren Petersen of Minden was introduced.

It was moved, seconded, and approved to approve the Minutes of the July 11, 2020, Presbytery meeting with no additions or corrections.

WORSHIP

Moderator Kirwin Stewart led the worship service. The offering from this worship service was to go to Nebraskans In Motion for Missions. Their efforts were explained in a video. Ruling Elder Vilmarie Cintron–Olivieri, who served as co–moderator of the 223rd General Assembly (2018) of the Presbyterian Church (USA), was the guest speaker via Zoom from Miami, Florida. Special music was performed by the Rev. Logan and Erin Ellis. Communion was conducted via ZOOM by Kirwin Stewart.

EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER'S REPORT

Polly Deppen–Williams reported that she continues to participate in ZOOM meetings and meetings with social distancing. Churches have been using Facebook live or Zoom to worship together along with socially distanced gatherings in the sanctuary. She continues to be proud of the creative ways churches are navigating the challenges to keep members safe while continuing to be the church.

REPORT OF NEBRASKA PRESBYTERY FOUNDATION

Audrey Richert, representative of the Nebraska Presbytery Foundation, described grants which will be available, beginning in December, to assist churches in reaching out to their communities.

REPORT OF PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

Annabelle Wells, Chairman of Presbyterian Women, reported on the Fall Gathering that was held via ZOOM on September 12th. Eighteen individuals from eight churches in the Presbytery attended the Gathering. The Churchwide Gathering is planned for August 2021.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

Jon Beggs, Council Chairman, gave the Council report. The Council met on September 15 and October 13. The Council approved the recommendation of the Personnel Committee to combine the positions of Stated Clerk and Executive Presbyter and that these positions will run concurrently. The Council has also determined that congregations may continue their same officers for another year, due to the Covid pandemic. Churches are to contact Pastor Polly for details.

REPORT OF BUSINESS & BUDGET

Jon Beggs presented the Report of the Business and Budget Committee. It is his belief that the Presbytery is making the best use of available dollars. He presented the Financial Status of the Presbytery as of August 31, 2020, comparing the Year-to-Date totals to the 2020 Budget. He also presented the Statement of Financial Position for the Presbytery as of August 31, 2020, compared to 12/31/2017, 12/31/2018 and 12/31/2019.

REPORT OF PERSONNEL

Edgar (Eddie) Mariel, Chair of the Personnel Committee, gave the committee report. The Personnel Committee recommended that the renewal schedule for the State Clerk position be modified to November 1 to coincide with the renewal schedule for the Executive Presbyter Position. Approved.

The Personnel Committee recommended that the Rev. Polly Deppen–Williams be elected to a 3–year term as Stated Clerk starting November 1, 2020. Approved.

The Personnel Committee recommended that the salary of the Executive Presbyter and Stated Clerk be increased by the same percentage as the pastors' salary increase. Approved.

The Personnel Committee recommended that Judy Rothenberger's salary be increased to \$22.00 per hour. Approved.

The Personnel Committee recommended that the Recording Secretary's salary remain the same.

REPORT OF PREPARATION FOR MINISTRY

Jill Boyd, Chairman, presented the committee report. The committee was encouraged to pursue the possibility of providing a site for the Bible Content Exam for those on the path for ordination. Kailen Soncksen and Janet Rasmussen are currently under the care of the committee.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY

Joyce Dean, Chairperson, presented the report. She listed the Church Moderators and stated that the churches in Beaver City and Superior are in transition. Churches in North Platte, Grand Island, Kearney and St. Paul have called new pastors. Joyce introduced the Rev. Will Ratcliff, new pastor at North Platte

The Committee recommended that the effective salary for pastors for 2021 be \$47,430. The salary was not raised in 2020. The recommendation is a two percent (2%) raise. Approved.

Minutes of February 9, 2021 meeting were **APPROVED** as presented.

Communications – reports to be posted with the March 27 Presbytery docket are due Monday, March 15.

Polly gave a brief Executive Presbyter and State Clerk report.

- The Lilly Grant Endowment, which was received in 2018 in collaboration with the Omaha Presbyterian Foundation, is being offered again for an additional 5 years. Funds will continue to be used for coaching pastors. The hope is to expand this offering to a larger pastor base. Council gave their blessing to pursue CNP involvement.
- She will be having surgery on March 31, 2021. All CNP concerns are to be directed to Joyce Dean.
- She has received multiple requests from new members serving on Council and Committees for job descriptions. These need to be developed and added to the manual.

Personnel Committee – Eddie reported that they met to review Judy Rothenberger, Office Administrator. He also reported that Polly will be out of the office for surgery but anticipates being accessible during her absent time.

Business and Budget Committee -

- CNP will be receiving \$22,188.92 in PPP funds.
- Business & Budget budgeted \$12,500.00 for 2021 Technical Grants. This money is now depleted.
