WORSHIP WITH THE CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

The presbytery entered into worship. The Rev. Laura Stubblefield, of United Campus Ministry, University of Nebraska, Kearney, delivered the message on the study and meaning of Parables and on the work of the campus ministry at UNK. Eddie Mariel officiated at the Lord's Supper, with Ed Heusinkvelt, Curt Rickertsen and Mary Reed assisting as servers. Holly Rickertsen provided special music. An offering was received for United Campus Ministry at UNK.

Don Canady made an announcement regarding the Nebraska Presbytery Foundation which has grants available to churches in Nebraska to enhance their ministry.

Corresponding Member Ethan Feistner, teaching elder at the Church of the Plains in Edgar was seated.

The following First Time Commissioners were introduced: Gary Nation, First Presbyterian, Holdrege; Sandy McKirahan, Kearney; and Gene Ellis, Beaver City.

Newly installed Ministers of Word and Sacrament Nancy Tuma, First Presbyterian Kearney, and Becky Dobitsch, Broken Bow, were introduced.

The Minutes of the June 30, 2018 meeting were approved, seconded, carried as presented.

EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER'S REPORT

The Executive Presbyter's report was presented by Executive Presbyter Polly Deppen—Williams. She has been very busy and active performing her duties including preaching, visiting church members, attending worship services, attending and conducting meetings, and many other activities. She is working with new pastors and will help churches in any way possible. Polly has presented a program on Expanding Rural Ministry.

CAMPUS MINISTRY REPORT

Laura Stubblefield, leader of Campus Ministry at University of Nebraska, Kearney, presented the report on campus ministry. Campus Ministry is an outreach to youth at the college, helping them to live and grow in faith together. Several of the students who are active in the campus ministry shared their stories of their involvement in the ministry. The Presbytery can assist with the campus ministry by providing monetary contributions, water and pop or by hosting a meal for 12-15 of the students on Sunday night.

VOTE ON AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (USA) Amendments to the Constitution of PCUSA (the <u>Book of Order</u>) as approved by the 223rd General Assembly (2018) and recommended to the presbyteries for their vote – It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved to vote on all the amendments at once. It was moved, seconded and passed unanimously to approve all of the Amendments to the Constitution approved by the 223rd General Assembly (2018).

REPORT OF THE YOUTH COMMITTEE

Dan Davis, Chairman of the Youth Committee, presented the report of the Youth Committee.

The Youth Committee had nearly \$5,000.00 in scholarships available in 2018.

The Youth Triennium will be in July 2019. Several thousand youth, students in middle school through high school, attend this conference which is held every three years at Purdue University.

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY REPORT

Kirwin Stewart, Chairman, presented the report. He thanked Dan Davis for his work on the Youth Committee.

The Committee on Ministry appointed the following Church Moderators: Beaver City—Dan Davis; Grand Island—Gary Smith; O'Neill and Bethany—Dean Segar; Valentine—Lisa Danielson (member South Dakota Presbytery); Sutherland quarterly—Kirwin Stewart; St. Paul—Doug McHargue; Keystone quarterly—Rev. Dan Davis (meets in Paxton); Superior—Rev Ivan and Joyce Dean; Kenesaw—Brad Jepsen— North Platte—David Boyd; Axtell—Kirwin Stewart; Benkelman—Elder Arlene Stute.

The Committee granted Karen Woo permission to labor within the bounds of East Iowa Presbytery.

The Committee recommended to have the Presbytery honorably retire The Rev. Kathryn Bates. It was moved, seconded and approved to honorably retire The Rev. Kathryn Bates.

It was moved, seconded and approved to transfer Nancy Tuma to this Presbytery from Homestead Presbytery.

The Committee recommended to increase the minimum salary for ministers by \$1,000.00, from \$45,500 to \$46,500 for 2019. This would affect BOP due @37% by \$370.00. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to increase the minimum salary to \$46,500 for 2019.

COMMITTEE ON PREPARATION FOR MINISTRY

Committee Chairman, Jill Boyd, presented the report of the Committee. Current members of the committee are Greg Allen–Picket, Jim Gallentine, Dave Irwin, Julie Thomsen and Jill Boyd (chair). Karen Woo resigned from the committee due to her call in another presbytery.

Annual assessments were conducted of Logan Ellis and Sharon Rees. They both continue to do well in their seminary classes and pastoral formation. The Committee approved Logan's move from inquirer to candidate.

David Johnson remains under the care of the committee but cannot be ordained by the presbytery if his first call is by UCC, so he will be in UCC tradition for a couple of years. Janet Gericke is under the care of the committee as she has enrolled at the University of Dubuque to complete the courses required of Commissioned Ruling Elders (CREs) in the PCUSA.

Review of current policies and procedures in the Presbytery Manual of Operations are on hold until broader conversations about both the COM & CPM can take place.

PRAYERS -

Executive Presbyter Polly announced that there had just been a shooting in Pittsburgh, PA, and led those present in prayers for the people in Pittsburgh.

COUNCIL REPORT

Chairman Joyce Dean reported for the Presbytery Council. Revisions to the Presbytery Manual are underway. Commissioned lay pastors are now called Commissioned Pastors and Teaching Elders are now called Ministers of Word and Sacrament. Gothenburg, Cozad, Lexington, Broken Bow and North Platte are in the process of organizing and developing the Koinonia Project. Groups of pastors have been organized to provide pastoral support.

Locations for 2019 Presbytery Meetings are as follows: March 23, First Presbyterian Church, Gothenburg; June 22, Community Church, Fairfield; and October 26, First Presbyterian Church, Hastings

BUSINESS AND BUDGET COMMITTEE REPORT

In the absence of chairman Steve Soundy, Executive Presbyter Polly presented the report of the Business and Budget Committee.

Financial reports from Synod are now up—to—date. Synod has been paying Presbytery bills while Synod financial software and bill—paying systems were updated. Money will be transferred to reimburse Synod for those expenditures when itemization is received.

Churches are requested to compare the remittance report with their own church records to be sure the report is accurate.

The Stapleton manse has been sold, netting \$64,000.00. The Committee approved investing these funds for future church development.

The Committee approved having a full professional audit completed every third year, beginning in 2019. This will require a change to the bylaws.

The Committee recommended increasing per capita by \$1.50. Presbytery of Central Nebraska total per capita will be \$33.50; which includes GA \$8.95; Synod \$5.40; and Presbytery \$19.15. This action was approved.

The Committee recommended approval of the 2019 budget, which is attached hereto as Attachment A and incorporated herein. This action was approved.

The statement of financial activity is attached to these Minutes as Attachment B and incorporated herein.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE REPORT

The report of the Personnel Committee was presented by David Boyd, Co–Chair. The Committee conducted the annual performance review of Executive Presbyter Polly and agreed that her performance has been positive. She has served as a cheerleader encouraging ministers to come to this Presbytery. The Committee recommended a modest increase in her compensation.

The Committee and Polly are working on revisions to the policy and procedures manual.

Committee on Preparation for Ministry Presbytery of Central Nebraska Meeting March 23, 2019

Current members of the CPM include Greg Allen-Pickett, Becky Dobitsch, Dave Irwin, Julia Thomsen, and Jill Boyd (chair).

The CPM met on December 5, 2018 to make decisions about the remaining funds in our 2018 budget. Checks were issued to the three folks under care who are still in seminary to assist with educational expenses.

We currently have four individuals under our care:

Logan Ellis is a Candidate. He is on-track to graduate in May 2020. He has passed the three ordination exams he has taken and plans to take the last two in April. The CPM will meet with him this summer for an annual review.

Janet Gericke is an Inquirer for the CLP training. She completed her first semester of classes last fall and is currently taking one class. The CPM will meet with this summer for an annual review.

David Johnson has been approved to seek a call in the PCUSA. He plans to remain in his call at the UCC congregation he currently serves, and is pursuing an inquiry into being ordained in that tradition. Should he still be in that process, we will meet with him this summer for an annual review.

Sharon Rees is Candidate and in her final semester of seminary. She has passed all five ordination exams and will be final assessed by the CPM in the next few months.

The ordination exam schedule will be changing to three times per year beginning in the fall, and with that change each presbytery will only be asked to read exams once a year. We will be notified in April or May as to when our reading period will be. We are currently slated for spring 2020, but that is subject to change. We expect to know by our next presbytery meeting.

The CPM will meet in the coming months as needed to support and assess those who are under our care and to make suggested revisions of the CPM's current policies and procedures in the Presbytery Manual of Operations.

Council minutes from January 15, 2019 were APPROVED as presented.

Council heard reports from:

- Executive Presbyter reported on her work as EP & Stated Clerk. She continues to work on details involving the Lilly Endowment Grant. February 25-27, 2019 she will be attending Presbytery Leader Formation in Louisville, KY.
- Personnel Committee reported that they met on January 29, 2019. They completed the annual review of Office Administrator, Judy Rothenberger. Central Nebraska Presbytery Personnel Committee January 29, 2019

The meeting was opened with a story and prayer from David Boyd.

The committee then proceeded to a review of Office Administrator, Judy Rothenburger. Judy explained how her year has gone. The biggest challenge was working with the financial situation at the Synod level, and while things are not perfect yet, they are vastly improved. She reported that Business and Budget still needs more members. She is currently working on Triennium and the Presbytery website. She reiterated some of the accomplishment as reported in the April minutes of this committee and is excited about the continuing work of the Presbytery.

The committee agreed that her performance evaluation was extremely positive. The office functions well and no one on the committee has heard anything but positive comments on Judy and the way the office works.

Judy's job description will remain the same. Her hours weekly have averaged between 16 and 18.

It will be recommended to council that her compensation be raised to \$21.55 an hour to reflect the raise in the cost of living beginning March 1, 2019

Concerns for the future were reported as needing a TV for the conference room to accommodate meetings held by Skype, and the showing of videos and etc. and the lease on the office is up in September of 2020 and Business and Budget and Council will be reviewing whether the lease should be renewed.

The remainder of the meeting was spent reviewing and updating the Presbytery's Personnel Policies. Polly was going to check on some Book of Order References and Synod connects to finalize this. Revisions will be made and it will be referred to Council for final approval at the February 19 Council meeting.
