Dr. Susan LaFleshe Picotte, the first Native American to receive a medical degree, built a hospital on the Omaha Reservation in 1913. The hospital is currently being restored to include a medical clinic, cultural and educational spaces, as well as an outdoor amphitheater and community gardens. Dr. Picotte had many connections to the Presbyterian Church, serving as a Sunday School teacher and interpreter at First Presbyterian Church in Walthill, NE, so it is special that we now have an opportunity to help make this restoration project possible.


