

The stated meeting of the Presbytery of Central Nebraska convened at 9:00 a.m. at First Presbyterian Church, Hastings, Nebraska, on Saturday, October 26, 2019. The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer by Moderator Jon Beggs. The Presbytery and Presbyterian Women were welcomed by Rev. Gregg Allen-Picket, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. He explained that the meeting was centered around mission work and the partnership with the United States/Mexican Border church partners.

STATED CLERK'S REPORT

Stated Clerk Polly Deppen-Williams presented her report, including that there is no imbalance in the number of teaching elders and the number of ruling elders entitled to vote at any meeting, therefore no remedial action is needed to redress any imbalance in voting. She also presented the current roster of the members of the permanent judicial commission whose terms have expired within the past six years.

As required, she presented the list of the membership of Presbytery and churches in the Presbytery of Central Nebraska, along with information on insurance, that Statistic Reports were completed, and the report of pastoral compensation had been presented to Presbytery.

It was moved, seconded, and approved to move the June 27, 2020, Presbytery meeting to July 11, 2020, because of a date conflict with General Assembly.

It was moved, seconded and approved to allow two Elders at the First Presbyterian Church in Kenesaw to serve a third consecutive term because of the small number of people available to serve.

The roll was formed. Stated Clerk Polly Deppen-Williams declared a quorum present.

The docket was presented and approved.

It was moved and seconded to seat Mark Adams as a corresponding member.

First-time commissioner Jennifer Jensen of Superior was introduced.

The minutes of the June 22, 2019, Presbytery meeting were approved, seconded and carried, after correction of the name of Bob Butz.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN'S REPORT

Annabelle Wells presented the report of Presbyterian Women. She stated that the Presbyterian Women were glad to be meeting at the same time as Presbytery. It is the first time the two groups have shared a meeting date.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT

Linda Anthony, Chairman, presented the printed nominating committee report, with the correction that Dave Irwin was to be removed from the 3-year term on the Committee on Preparation. Linda moved that the slate be approved. It was seconded and passed.

WORSHIP WITH THE CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Presbytery entered into worship, which was conducted by Presbyterian Women, Greg Allen-Pickett and Mark Adams. The offering collected was to go to Frontera de Cristo, the Presbyterian border ministry in Douglas/Agua Prieta. Greg Allen-Pickett and Mark Adams officiated at the Lord's Supper, with Brian and Laurie Johnson, Kay Georgianna and Nancy Grams assisting as servers.

WE RESPOND TO HEARING THE WORD

Executive Presbyter Polly Deppen-Williams presented her report, including the meetings she has attended with pastors and others, churches visited and Presbytery related meetings. She also met with Synod and Denomination leaders and completed an update to Presbytery Rolls & Registers. Polly continues to work of the update of the Presbytery Manual.

Executive Presbyter Polly announced that Guy Helms will be installed on November 17th as the new pastor at the Valentine church. The first retreat to be held for 1st call pastors will be at the Aurora leadership center on November 4-8.

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY REPORT

Kirwin Stewart, Chairman, presented the report, including the Church Moderators appointed, and FIT interviews conducted for Presbyterian UCC Church, Aurora, and Bethany/O'Neil. The COM has approved Guy Helm's Installation Commission for November 17 at 4:30 pm. The COM approved the request of First Presbyterian, Superior, to form a PNC. The COM approved the transfer of Rev. Guy Helm's membership from Wyoming Presbytery to Central Nebraska Presbytery. The COM also approved Penny Schultz to serve the Aurora PUCC Church as Commissioned Pastor, with her installation November 10th.

The transfer of Revs Stephen and Caroline Price Gibson's memberships to Baltimore Presbytery was approved. The COM moved Rev. Dr. David McCarthy to Member at Large status.

The Litany of Praise for the First Presbyterian Church of Stapleton was led by Kirwin Stewart. The manse has been sold. Polly Deppen-Williams and Steve Soundy were thanked for their work on this project. The church building has been gifted to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church which is the remnant of PCUSA members.

COUNCIL REPORT

Ivan Dean, Chairman of Council, presented the Council report. There have been no actions of Council which require Presbytery approval. Council accepted the invitation of First Presbyterian Church, Kearney, to host the Presbytery meeting March 28, 2020. First Presbyterian Church, Grand Island, has withdrawn an earlier invitation to host this meeting.

BUSINESS AND BUDGET REPORT

Don Anthony, Chair of the Business and Budget Committee, presented the report. The Council voted to approve the 2020 CNP Budget as presented. The Council also voted to approve the Draft Investment and Spending Policy prepared by Jim Koon and to have Business and Budget continue moving forward. The Council voted to approve the opportunity for churches in central Nebraska combing work comp policies under a master policy to be held by Presbytery of Central Nebraska. The Presbytery would pay the premium and be reimbursed by the churches.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE REPORT

David Boyd, Chair of the Personnel Committee, presented the report. The Committee reviewed the work of Judy Howard and Polly Deppen-Williams and made recommendations to Council regarding their compensation.

Ivan Dean as Chair of Council presented the budget to the Presbytery. The Council recommended the Presbytery receive the budget which was approved.

PREPARATION FOR MINISTRY COMMITTEE

Jill Boyd, Chair of the Preparation for Ministry Committee, presented the report. The Committee voted unanimously to seek Presbytery approval of Logan Ellis being ready to seek a call. The Presbytery approved. Kailen Soncksen is under the care of the Committee as an Inquirer. The Committee planned to meet with Janet Rasmussen who is pursuing the path to become a certified lay pastor after this Presbytery meeting.

The CPM was approved to act on behalf of the presbytery to receive individuals under care as inquirers, assess them and move them to candidacy when ready, and certify them ready to seek a call when they have completed all requirements and all other tasks or decisions related to the CPM with those under their care.

NEBRASKA PRESBYTERY FOUNDATION

Audrey Richert presented information on the Nebraska Presbytery Foundation. There are funds available for church expansion or increase of church activities.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Jon Beggs, Moderator, led the prayers of the people.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business to come before the Presbytery.

INSTALLATION

Jon Beggs, Moderator, installed Kirwin Stewart as the 2020 Moderator of the Central Nebraska Presbytery and Sharon Rees as the 2020 Vice Moderator.

It was moved and seconded and passed to adjourn the meeting. Kirwin Stewart closed the meeting with prayer.

Logan Ellis Statement of Faith

- 2 I believe in the Triune God, Who is formed of, and in, the Father, Son, and Holy
- 3 Spirit. God is the dynamic unity and celebrated distinctions of these three persons.
- 4 Each member of the Triune God can only be understood through their self-giving
- 5 relationships in, with, and through each other. God is not divisible, and is supremely
- 6 sovereign over all creation, which was spoken forth into being by God from nothing.
- 7 God is abounding in love, cloaked in mystery, enacts justice, and ultimately is far
- 8 beyond our understanding. All we can understand comes through God's self-
- 9 disclosure through His special relationship with the chosen people of the Old
- 10 Testament, and His complete disclosure in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, entering
- into our humanity.

- I believe that humanity was created in the Image of God. Just as God is Triune,
- humanity can only be understood in its relationships with each other, the Triune God,
- and creation. We live into our true identity when we emulate God's relationships.
- Unfortunately this reflection has been shattered through sin. I believe that original sin
- has not only sundered God's relationship to humanity, but also humanity's
- 17 relationship with itself and creation. We understand the world through broken glasses,
- as sin has crept into every crevice: down to the core of humanity. It hinders and
- damages all aspects of humanity's relationships, identity, and function.

I believe that in the Incarnation, God took on our sinful humanity by Jesus Christ, effectively bonding Christ to our depraved condition. Christ became our intercessor to God through holding both divine and human natures. These natures are collaborative and integrative: there is no competition or domination of one over the other. Christ lives in perfect relationship to God and creation, and took on the suffering of sin for all humanity through the Passion. Christ suffered the furthest depths of humanity, and truly died. Christ descended to Hell itself, and bridged the separation between humanity and God. Our human nature died with Christ. After three days, Christ victoriously arose from the dead triumphant. Since our human nature was bonded to Christ, it arose with him. Christ ascended, along with our renewed human nature, to the Triune Godhead. Our relationship to God has been restored, and we are now in communion with God.

This is not the end of the humanity's story, however. We still live in a world ravaged by the effects of sin, and it groans in eagerness for the full restoration by Jesus. Christians are continually transformed through the work of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit serves a crucial role in mediating Christ to humanity, and leads the Church in service and complete allegiance to Christ. The Christian is living into the new nature bound to Christ. There are times of victory and defeat, but the presence of Christ is guaranteed every step of the way. There is comfort in the Christian life as God is sovereign over all creation and is in relationship with us.

The Church is formed of those who have been led and accept bondage to Christ's rule, death, and life through the waters of baptism. The faithful gather to worship God in community: reflecting the image of God they are created in. Through the sacrament of Communion, Christians participate in fellowship that cuts through time and space in celebration and remembrance of Christ's atoning work. The Church confesses its witness that has been given to it by the Holy Spirit and seeks to testify to the miraculous grace, love, work, power, and justice of the Triune God. I believe the Church must look in anticipation to the return of Jesus Christ and work the fields of Christ: all creation. I believe the return of Christ will be a renewal of creation, which gives Christians hope as it will come from the same Triune God who tenderly spoke all into being.

Logan Ellis Biographical/Faith Journey

I am from Beaver City, Nebraska. It is a classic rural town in Nebraska. My immediate family includes my parents, Ben and Gina, and my two younger sisters, Peyton and Savanah. I was raised in First Presbyterian Church, Beaver City. As I became more involved in my youth group and church activities, I remember becoming more and more engaged with scripture, particularly the Old Testament stories. I found many great experiences through the mission team and other activities such as being a part of a yearly passion play. I was challenged in my faith when I realized my actions did not reflect my beliefs, which cultivated my understanding of interacting with others. My vocational discernment has been a path of God affirming this sense of call to pastoral ministry. I have always wanted to help others as a vocation, and more and more God was affirming and developing my gifts of ministry. I became very interested in theology, and read works such as the *Institutes* and several apologetic works. After high school I was accepted to Hastings College.

While at Hastings, my degree of study was Religion with an Emphasis in Christian Ministry, and a minor in Psychology. During college I was able to be heavily involved in several religious groups such as: a Christian fraternity, a Christian Ministry group, and a worship ministry group. I also experienced a great shift in my life when I began to live my faith more intentionally. My faith was expanded and

challenged as I was learning more and more about the great Christian tradition in various classes, experiences, and conversations among my brothers and sisters in faith. Before college, I felt my call to be a rural minister as I experienced how impactful it can be. During college, many of my friends in Christ affirmed my educational gifts, and opened my eyes to another call: education. I had many great mentors in college to explore what this meant for my original call. I read and studied several important theological texts such as the *Confessions* and the *Freedom of the Will*. During my time in Hastings I met my wife, Erin. She has been profoundly important to my life in providing me with a new way to see things, and a new way to understand being in relationship with others.

I graduated from Hastings College and then was accepted into the first year of a special program at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. This program was called the Young Adult Ministry Scholar program, which was a unique opportunity to develop and explore my call and gifts of ministry. By the end of the first year, I was the only one left in the program's first year. Currently there are 14 scholars in this growing program. While attending UDTS, I was very fortunate to have the preparation of Hastings College. I am involved with multiple aspects of the undergraduate campus such as the food pantry, student scholars, campus ministry, and student advising. In this special role, I also taught undergraduate classes including one of my own making. I have been able to appreciate how the two calls of ministry, rural ministry and education, do not conflict, and work together. I passed my ordination exams, along with my classes at UDTS. I was able to be in multiple ministries such as a seminarian intern at two churches, pulpit supply for several churches, and start a young adult ministry. After my second year of ministry, Erin and I were married. Marriage has been a profound blessing to us. We are currently discerning the place to which God is calling and the potential ministry for both of us. I feel that my call has reflected Peter's, who was lovingly led by Jesus as a rural person to proclaiming and testifying to Jesus's life, death, and resurrection.
